## IN HONOR OF THE LATE

 DHARMACHARYA LALDHARRY SEERATTAN
## LIFE \& LEGACY OF DHARMACHARYA SEERATTAN - 37 YEARS OF COMMUNITY SERVICE

Pandit Laldharry Seerattan was born on October 5th 1933 in No. 56 Village in Corentyne, Berbice, Guyana to Shivrattan Maharaj and Sanpatti Maharaj. He was the husband of the beautiful Oomriah Seerattan, with whom he shared 67 years of marriage and worked along as a rice farmer.

On May 8, 1983, Pt. Laldharry Seerattan, his wife and children migrated to the United States to pursue the American dream. He was a great devotee of Durga Maa and in 1988, his dream become a reality when he founded Shri Devi Mandir in Jamaica, Queens. He was supported by his family and members of the community. His son, Pt. Tillackdharry Seerattan, followed in his path and is the spiritual leader of the mandir today. In 1995, Pt. Seerattan and his wife built the Shiv Shakti Mandir at No 56 Village, Corentyne. The mandir was maintained by them, and every month food and clothing are shipped to the Mandir and distributed to local villages.

Pt. Laldharry Seerattan offered his selfless service to the community and to international organizations. He worked closely with the BAPS Care International through which, in 2005, he built a well in a village in rural India to provide clean drinking water. He donated funds to natural disasters worldwide, including to the Gujrat and Pakistan earthquake, Guyana flood, Hurricane Katrina, Haiti earthquake, Guyana Mission, and Superstorm Sandy. He also sponsored Thanksgiving lunch in the senior citizen community in Richmond Hill, Queens.

Pt. Seerattan has made contributions to the medical community, including the Division of Cardiology at North Shore LIJ and Queens Hospital Center to provide cardiology equipment and to aid in cancer research. He has also contributed to organizations supporting injured veterans. Globally, he sponsored 25 eye surgeries through Sankara Eye Foundation and 15 lip surgeries through Operation Smile Medical Mission.

Pt. Seerattan was the religious director and founder of the Shri Devi Mandir Global Humanitarian Foundation Inc (SDMGHFI). In November 2014, the organization built a home for a disabled mother in Bath Settlement WCB Guyana, and another one in October 2015 at No. 56 Village, Corentyne. The organization also distributes food hampers to the underprivileged, purchased eyeglasses for the less fortunate, and sponsored a scholarship for a student to attend University of Guyana.

His legacy continues through his 11 children, 29 grandchildren, 40 great grandchildren and 1 great-great grandchild. His grandchildren have gone on to have careers in esteemed fields such as the medical field, aviation, education, clinical research, finance, technology, art, business and engineering.
