IDC Congratulates 47th USA President-Elect Donald J. Trump and Vice President-Elect Sen J.D. Vance



The **Indian Diaspora Council International** (IDC), representing its global membership and affiliates, extends its congratulations to **Donald J. Trump** on his election as the 47th President of the United States and to **Senator JD Vance** as the Vice President-elect. Their victory in the 2024 US presidential elections marks a significant moment in American political history.

The Trump-Vance ticket emerged victorious after a closely contested election, securing the mandate to lead the nation for the next four years.
